The space between letters and words shows how much personal space someone needs. Reese's varied word and letter spacing—some narrow, some wide—suggests that she sometimes gets weirded out by the Hollywood hoopla that surrounds her.

Clever letter combinations (like the s-h in "trash") signal that Reese is supersmart and gets new ideas quickly. She's innovative and highly independent.

Reese's self-partrait, with its big smile, reflects someone who's outgoing and happy-go-lucky, but the small round eyes indicate there's a lot going on inside that she doesn't share with most people. Her drawing style shows that she's image-conscious and has a talent for aesthetics. — Sheila Lowe
